

## Angus, Richard B. Papers

In the Hill papers are three letterpress books of Angus, two of them as <sup>vice</sup> president of the Manitoba Road and the other as vice president of the Canadian Pacific Road. They cover the years from 1879 to 1883. [In Ottawa are preserved in the National Archives several other letterbooks. *Bank of Montreal, Montreal, also, has papers* The letters in the Hill papers for the Manitoba Road relate to: appointments of staff members and applications for those and other positions; Molyneux St. John and his job in England to secure as many purchasers of the Company's lands as possible; social life in St. Paul to a limited extent; George Stephen, his opinions, journeys

to England to get aid for the Canadian Pacific;  
that railroad's difficulties; Hill and his  
journeys and activities; Willie Stephen, brother  
of George and his farm in the Red River Valley;  
also Angus' brother-in-law, Mr. Renny, who set-  
tled in the same farmland community of Stephen;  
Angus' advice to prospective purchasers of land  
from the railroad company; St. Paul and Minne-  
sota weather;
