Re Stickney's misunderstanding of what was expected of him by the Board re sale of lots at crossing of the Assiniboine River. With firm action by the president [Geo. Stephen] everything is straightened out and sales are brisk for the Company now. Best site later will probably be a crossing 30 or 40 miles farther west. Re delivery of 300 flat cars "with least possible delay. Northern Pacific Road says it cannot furnish cars to move any of the steel from Duluth. Remember, it takes about 30 days for a car to reach Winnipeg from Montreal, so have ~~the~~ rails & fastenings spatched promptly. There

is a proposition before the Winnipeg city council to give a bonus of \$200,000 for building a line from Winnipeg southwest; it is intended for Schultz's company, but we hope to capture it.
