Encloses copy of letter just received from T. Jefferson Coolidge, Jr. of Boston, dated February 14, 1899. Coolidge was a Director in the Pacific Coast Company.

Coolidge discusses a coal and railroad proposition submitted to the Northern Pacific Road by Guerin, which would shorten the N. P. line into Seattle by twenty-two miles.

Also discusses the receivership of the
