Mrs. Cavileer, Pembina, to Hill

Re her troubles, old happy visits to the Kittson home, and her last sight of Hill. "I see by the St Paul paper you are to loose a daughter [Rachel?] by marriage." On Aug. 5, 1913, Hill wrote to the Atty.-gen. of U. S. on her behalf. See also Aug. 16, 1913 for a carbon of Hill to John Burke, Treas. of US. "The enclosed letter is from Mr. A. L. Carpenteur, the oldest white settler of Minnesota, who came to Saint Paul in 1841....., in behalf of Mrs [Chas.] Cavileer's son, who desires to retain the postmastership." Asks his intercession with Postmaster General.
