

Chicago, Great Western Railway Co. 1899

In 1892 the Chicago, St. Paul and Kansas City Railway Company was re-organized into the Chicago Great Western Railway Company. The company had started out as the Minnesota and Northwestern Company in 1884. 510 miles of railway was built. In 1886 the Chicago, St. Paul and Kansas City Railway Company was organized and acquired the Minnesota and Northwestern lines. It built 302 additional miles.
