I have doubt that these lands will within the se sale able for a price that will pay more than the cost of the entire stock of the St. Paul & Duluth Co. We have added several million tons to our iron tonnage on the Range and are now building spurs to ten or twehte mines, all of which will be shipping next year so that our ore tonnage next yr bids fair to reach 7,000,000 tons or equal to 35,000 tons per day during the season of Lake navigation ...
