First engineer of the Minnesota and Pacific Railroad. He held this position for about a year, when David Shepard became chief engineer. In 1859 Crooks again became chief engineer, and continued to hold this office until the company ended. In 1862 he was appointed colonel of the 6th regiment. When he returned from the war, he was made chief engineer of the Winona Division of the St. Paul & Pacific Railroad. He also had a contract to cons uct the railroad

from Delano to Breckenridge in 1869.
