the Populist & there must be a thorough reorganization. Makes a hereupon for Stanford Newel as against Hubbard supported by Senator Davis. Tells of Hubbard's misdeed. Hill has just persuaded the editor of one of our newspapers not to publish loss by Hill's friends of large sums on Hubbard's certificates of elevator grain who "were disposed to prosecute Hubbard & send him to Stillwater [penitentiary] for his connection with the transaction.
