"We have never had as many settlers going out into the new country as this year. All Government Lands east of the Dakotas is settled upon and thousands are going west into Montana and Washington. There is quite a movement from Iowas, Michigan and Wisconsin, and some from Southern Minnesota, into Western Manitoba, for cheap grain lands along the railway. I should not be surprised if this reached ten thousand settlers for the current year."
