Sends clippings re Sahlgaard's "new suit" & Judge Brill's decision in Sheriff Thompson's claim. Our lawyers think Sahlgaard's suit will not amount to anything, especially as Gilman [lawyer] tried to bring the suit before Judge Simons in opposing the confirmation "and the Judge very emphatically sat down upon him." S' friends suggest an amicable settlement, but I think it would open a door that we would have difficulty in closing later." Farley has gone home.
