FURBER, PIERCE [T.]^{P. 1} (d.1893) St. Louis, Mo. (A.I.A.)

During the 'eighties Mr. Furber served as a representative of the Boston firm of Peabody & Stearns in their St. Louis office, and in that capacity supervised the erection of the following buildings: Unitarian Church of the Messiah, Locust & Garrison Sts., 1881; Crow Memorial Art Gallery, 10th & Locust, 1881; St. Louis Club, Locust & Ewing. Also he built a home for himself on Lindall Ave. (east of Vandeventer) which in later years became the residence of Architect Tom Barnett.
