On March 11 Lord Grey, Gov. Gen. of Canada, wrote Hill asking that his yacht be anchored at Quebec for July 22-29, when the Prince of Wales and the British Atlantic Fleet would be anchored there, within sight of the Citadel. Would like "as many American yachts as possible" for Americans have Quebec as their "Mecca" as much as we do. Wolfe's victory leading indirectly to the Declaration of Independence." Hill accepted and wrote, p. 46, to Grey re this and the ensuing fishing trip to the St. John River with Earl Grey and others as guest.
