See account book kept by W.G.Tubby re construction of Manitoba Road in 1887 in which he refers to the record made in tracklaying out of Minot, Đakota Territory as follows:

"the wonderful record of track-laying made by the Canadian Pacific Railway, July 7, 1883, when 6 miles 120 ft. were laid, was beaten by the St. Paul, Minneapolis & Manitoba Railway on August 11, 1887, when 8 miles 1860 ft. were laid, making the World's Record, which up to date 1904, s never been beaten." "The credit of executing this wonderful performance in track-laming, and managing an organization to do i easily and without a single hitch, is due Mr. Donald Grant, Manager for the track laying force of Langdon-Shepard & Co. who superintended the work in person, and to J.H.Benson, the track laying foreman."
