Giving him "a complete statement of the Ore Trustees' business." Enclosing "Great Northern Iron Ore Properties, Memorandum from the Trustees." "This is the last year of the Steel Corporation lease." "As to development work being carried on by the subsidiary Companies of the Trustees with a view to operating our own properties, -- The first steps in this connection were taken early in 1912, a short time after notice was received that the Steel Company intended to surrender its lease January 1, 1915, when, under date of March 1, 1912, we secured from the Steel Corporation the surrender of all

lands covered by the lease of January 2, 1907, with the exception of the properties they were actually operating, and a few lands used in connection with such operations for stripping dump etc." Contracts at once let for stripping 3 mines: Dunwoody, Dean-Itasca (formerly Whiteside and Smith. Gives figures for these 3 developments. Re mining lease to Butler Bros. of St. Paul for certain lands since named the Harrison and North Harrison mines; development of mine to be called the Thorne. "In addition ... there will come back to us on account of the Steel Corporation's surrender of operating properties, effective January 1, 1915, the following mines, opposite the names of which I have shown the approximate tonnage that will be available in each property when

they are turned over to us:
