Mr. Haber has been here and I have given him such information as I could & started him to a few places this side of the Rocky Mts., principally the gold deposits in the Little Rockies. I will pick him up on ... the way and take him to the Coast with me. During the trip I will put him in a position where he can thoroughly investigate the promising locations. The copper indications near Mt. Index continue to be very promising, & I think we may reasonably expect to find ~~something~~ well worth while in that locality. There is also a recent discovery of quartz carrying native copper on the East side of the Cascade Range, which he will examine. The Trail

Creek country is to so extent falling short of the large expectations previously looked for. It has developed, in addition to the War Eagle & LeRoy two other considerable copper properties which promise well, but I think we will find larger and better near the Pacific Coast. Characterizes Kendrick, Winter and F; D. Underwood of the Soo Road, who is doing very well and whom I hope to see in the position of Genr. Manager of the Northern ~~Position.~~
