H.L. Higginson to James J. Hill.

The Boston Chamber of Commerce have asked Higginson to urge J.J.Hill to speak to them at a dinner meeting. Feels that Hill should know that the Chamber is employing Brandeis as counsel before the Interstate Commerce Commission. Has "known Mr. Brandeis for many years, recognize his ability and shrewdness, but have a profound distrust of him."

Higginson will not come to the dinner, and will "never go so lone she [Brandeis] is there."
