

Hill, James J.-Art Gallery April 9, 1917

W.S.Mears to Estate of J.J.Hill.

States that his company is "winding up the affairs of the Juul-Ingersoll company, photographers, who took over the photographing business of T.W.Ingersoll," and that his company found "a number of old negatives made from the late Mr. Hill's collection of paintings." Asks if his company should retain them

See also reply from [L.W.Hill], carbon for June 7, 1917, which states, "Referring to the matter of the old negatives of Mr. Hill's collection of paintings if agreeable to you we shall have somebody all for these negatives and take them off your hands."
