Reviews in some detail the Indian situation along the Border, re horse-stealing, and other depredations, and with references to Hill's own contacts with Indians, putting his steamboats on Red River first in 1870, contacts with Indians & half breeds, buying wood for his steamboats from one of them, the Canadian authorities' desires re Ind. raids and depredations in Minnesota & North Dakota (Turtle Mt.Inds.) &c.. Indian reservations should be far from the Border.
