Johnson has been defeated in No. Dakota "after a contest more determined and more desperate than anything we have ever had in the state."

States that he feels "more keenly the defeat of Johnson by the small margin on account of Alex [McKenzie]," and that "No man ever worked as determinedly as he did and no man could have accomplished so much."

"Alex slept neither night nor day as he conducted the fight almost single handed

against heavy odds, and I confess I fear a physical break-down will follow."
