"Jud was in St. Paul today and I got hold of him...had a very pleasant chat... He expressed himself very strongly as your friend for everything in the world... I took occasion to make him understand that all the old friends should stand together and stand by each other... I brought up John's name among others. At first he winced a little... but admitted that he was all right and that nothing would arise to draw them apart or make any feeling between them."
