Is comfortably settled in Berlin, Germany and has been working in the library of the Department of Public Works which "is undoubtedly the best of its kind, having practically a complete collection of railway literature for every country of the world."

Is working on the Northern Securities manuscript [Meyer later published A History of the Northern Securities Case" - Bulletin of the Univ. of Wis. no. 142, ly, 1906]

Has consented to take charge of writing a

history of transportation in the United States for the Carnegie Institution at Washington, D.C.
