[Portion of letter from Newel to "My dear Jim"]

The Roberts Co.(Pencoyd Iron Works) have lost to a German company the contract to build a bridge over the Ysel at Westerwoort, Holland, even though the Roberts Company were the lowest bidders.

The Dutch refiners have been in an uproar over the tariff on sugar. Thinks he has "sent a basketful of information to Washington on the subject of sugar. Has just presented his new milatary attache Colonel Wheelan of the Sth Cavalry to the Queen who is "a whols for strong, well trained little girl - carries herself well - dresses in good taste - has great self-possession, does not appear to be bashful, and justifies apparently the fondness which the people seem to have for her."
