

North Western Fuel Company.

Was incorporated May 1, 1877. The capital stock was \$100,000, to be divided into shares of \$50 each. The people who formed the corporation were; J.J.Hill, Chauncey W. Griggs, E.N.Saunders, William Rhodes, George S. Acker and Richard W. Johnson, all of St. Paul; and John a. Armstrong of Minneapolis. Continuance of the corporation was to be twenty years. See: articles of incorporation, May 1, 1877.
