

Hill & Acker Letterbooks 5 1875-1877

These are letterpress copies of letters of a coal and wood (fuel) firm in St. Paul, Much of the correspondence relates to orders for various kinds of coal handled by the company and rec'd mostly via Duluth and thence shipped out to various agents and the public. Some letters relate to cord wood, the wood train that brought in the oak, maple, &c. wood from about Lake Minnetonka, the logging crew kept there cutting wood and hauling it to the r.r. (St. Paul & Pac.) to be piled up alongside awaiting train, the tugs and barges towing wood across the lake, &c., some correspondence re Third Cong. District (Dem.) Committee of which Hill was secretary, some re State Agric. Assoc. (Driving Park in St. Paul) of

which he was also secy. Some deal with the Bismarck land cases involving J.J. Jackman, Ed. Hackett, Oscar Taylor, Gen. Sanborn, Hill himself, and John Proctor. One letter, Aug. 21, '76 appears to list the directors of the Agric. Asso
