

Hill, J.J.-Yacht

1907

In 1907 J.J. Hill evidently intended to build another yacht. He wrote to at least two boat-building companies in Canada -- (Grant, Oxley & Co. of Halifax, N.S. on October 30, 1907) and (New Burrell-Johnson Iron Co. of Yarmouth, N.S. on Dec. 4, 1907) describing the yacht, which was to be smaller than the Wacouta and which was to accomodate 12 or 14 passengers. On Feb. 6, 1908 Toomey wrote to the New Burrell-Johnson Iron Co., "It is contemplated, as perhaps you already know, to use this yacht in the Lower St. Lawrence and in the Gulf."

Apparently, for some reason, J.J.Hill cnanged

his mind, and the yacht was never built.
