Believes the Hendry properties in and near Victoria, B.C. should be taken over in the early Fall. Hendry has secured good terminals and in general, has done a fine piece of work. Believes the Great Northern Road should agree with the C.P.R. not to run car ferries to Victoria, as there is no good reason why either road should do so. Encloses statement showing operation of Hendry's lines for the past year.
