C.E.Perkins to James J. Hill.

Is deeply disturbed over the free silver situation. States that the "feeling in favor of free silver is growing so fast that it looks as if we are pretty sure to try to go it alone when we have a new President, unless, in the meantime, there is an international agreement." Believes that "the one thing to try for..is an international conference before our conventions in 1896."

Asks J.J.Hill if e should not talk

with President Cleveland about it, since  
what Hill would say would have weight  
with Cleveland.
