

Railroads-Snowstorms

January 10, 1907

Telegram. Jas. J. Hill to E. T. Nichols.

"Storm has continued in North Dakota for practically three weeks with temperature from twenty to thirty-eight below zero most of the time and high winds. Snow drifts in many places fifteen or more feet deep three to three and one-half feet on level. We are having more difficulty from snow than I have ever known."
