Hill to Richard B. Angus

Enclosed I hand you two letters and a sketch of Bow River Gap received last night and today from Major Rodgers [sic] Rodgers seems to be finding either new passes or new conditions in the old ones. He seems to be confident of success and I feel sure that a pass will be found not far from Bow River. You will notice that he speaks well of the Kananaskis [Pass] except for loss of distance and alignment. If the Kicking Horse pass can be reached from the West with a continuous grade of 100 feet. to the mile for 30 miles careful location and the use of switchbacks" [rest c sentence incomplete]
