He reports that he has a good and very direct line through the Kicking Horse Pass and says that he has enough information to remove any serious doubt about our being able to find a pass thro' the Selkirk range. He says the Selkirks have never been explored for a pass and the report of the Canadian Engineers was made in camp. Rogers has gone home to Waterville and will be ready to meet you when and where you say."
