Corn crop in ~~K~~ansas and Missouri has suffered badly and will not be much over half a crop. Iowa and Nebraska have a good corn crop so far and their wheat crop is unusually large. Morgan has announced his choice of Northern Pacific Board of Directors: Wm. Rockefeller, H. McK. Twombly, S. Rea of the Penn. Road, E. H. Harriman, and myself. He put Harriman in the Board to show that he had no personal malice." "We expect to have all the stock of the St. Peter Company except one hundred shares which so far seems to have been lost as it has not shown up for nearly forty years. However it is of very little consequence, only \$10,000 in any event. Mr. Morgan wishes the Gt.

Nor to practically control the whole situation through the holding Company." E.D.Adams has given Mr Morgan his resignation,which will of course be accepted."
