"Selkirk" -J.J.Hill's first steamboat on the Red River of the North.

Newspaper copy of drawing by H. Roth [?] is filed in gray fibredex box labeled, "Early photographs, negatives, and copperplates."

The maiden voyage of this boat took place April 23, 1871. It left McCauleyville, Minn bound for Winnipeg, having on board 115 passengers and 125 tons of freight.

The direct result of this trip was the

opening of the great Northwest to the Twin Cities.
