"We got our Legislation in the best possible shape to make it certain and while I felt sure of victory with a fair fight, still thought best to be safe and not fail especially when we had to build the road anyway. The way we settled it will probably take 125,000 acres out of the 200,000 but I think we will get thro' for much less another way, as the prices of lands are fixed by us and it may be a very long time before they can realize anything. I will explain all this fully when I see you." Business prospects are very good. Three and four carloads of passengers every morning going up looking for

lands.
