Adams has gatl ered up a great mass of data. I think I could see a faint desire on his part for unification of the two properties. I have seen Mr. Livingston and feel sure we will have his cooperation. "There is of course more or less feeling between his committee and that Mr. Adams but I can get his cooperation and the control of his bonds determination of what Company can be made to earn net and then the test and most practicable distribution of those earnings to the new bonds and stocks by an equitable mergin of the several classes into the new Company's securities."
