Stephen to S. S. Merrill Long and important letter. Disappointed that in our interview yesterday your Directors voiced objections to our building the Brown's Valley Line from Morris westward to Lake Traverse. Explains that it was begun under pressure of circumstances to prevent the construction of the Little Falls and Dakota line and because then we "came under obligation to the Settlers who. have (mainly under the auspices of Bishop Ireland entered upon lands of the Company to fur-nish them with Railway facilities." Refers to an interview Hill had with the March, 1879, that led to a proposition the buy company should buy the Hastings and Dakota ine which we would have been glad to do, but waterlined to entertain .. from a desire not to interfere with the negotiations you had already instituted" This led us, when you did buy that railway to a belief you approved our building the Brown's Valley Line.
