Richard B. Angus to George Stephen, Causacapsca
Quebec

Reports on ten day trip to N.W. Terry. with
Stickney - 350 miles, "embracing all the located
line and about 110 miles of the projected route.
Describes the loveliness of the countryside &
of the view at the south bend of the Assiniboine
River from the heights overlooking the valley.
Mentions "a noble elk with magnificent antlers
[that] bolted past [us]." Gen. Rosser, who went
west to explore north of Moose Mt. writes from
Qu'Appelle of a similar view there. Re Manit-
oba Southwestern Ry. situation, which is un-

satisfactory, and Scholtz. I made a counter proposal to the city council. Re Gov. Gen.-- Lord Lorne's party from Ottawa and Menzie's joining them. Re change in the ~~xx~~ route, for original plan "would have left Winnipeg upon a spur track."
