Bad roads from wet and heavy transc make team travel west of Winnipeg almost impossible.What I worry about now is lumber & fuel for the settlers who have gone out onto the prairies, and coal for engines in Manitoba. Manvellis working too hard & will not be able to keep it up. Have not had any definite reply from Atkins but I expec him to come. Judge Young is at work on his 822 brief after a complete breakdown.Judge Treat annulled Bigelow's demurrer in the Farley suit and intimated that the R.R.
