Sweeney was in charge of the engine, boilers and steam plant in the basement of Hill's property at 212 First Avenue, South in Minneapolis. The letters that passed between Sweeney and W. C. Toomey about coal. lumber shavings, screenings, sawdust and wood chips as fuel for the plant, as well as letters concerning the upkeep and repairs of the plant, are voluminous. Sweeney retired in January, 1903 and moved to Great Falls, Montana, where he was apparently to work for he Great Falls Water Power and Townsite Capany. See carbon of
