A long and important letter, telling much of what has been going on with relation to: attempt of Union Pacific to purchase control of Burlington; terms of purchase of that road by Hill's roads; prospects for the future excellent; advantages of having the Burlington, which gives terminals and access to the great provisions and lumber districts and cities of the country (Chicago, Omaha, Iowa, St. Louis, &c.); etc. Wants Stephen to come over and go over all his lines and then take a salmon-fishing trip to Labrador on the new yacht, "Wacouta."
