

Upham, Henry Pratt

1837 -1909

Upham was born in Mullburg, Mass. His father was a patentee and maker of waterwheels in Worceste
When H.P. was 15 yrs. old he went to live in Springfield, Mass, and then to Tolland, Conn.
working in stores and a bank for about 4 yrs;
then he went to Michigan, where he worked in the woods, getting out logs for mills. In Feb., 1857, he started for St. Paul, where he ran a saw-mill for a time, then entered the bank in St. Paul, and for almost 50 yrs. was connected with it (it became the First Nat'l Bank of St. Paul

He was a good friend of Judge Young, of the Supreme Court, and with Stanford Newel and Hill In 1868 he married Evelyn G. Burbank and they had two daughters, Mrs. John F. Harris of Tuxedo Park, N.Y., and Mrs. Horace E. Bigelow of St. Paul. A son died in May, 1909. There is a picture of Upham facing page 116.
