"I have given a great deal of attention to the analysis of the vote case, and find through the West, South-West, and South, that organized labor, outside of Railway Engineers and Conductors, has been practically opposed to anything bearing the semblance of law or order. The independent vote of the country, call it by whatever name you may, seems to have increased in number, and I think this vote will control National elections in the future more than in the past."
