Press dispatches daily alluding to some difference between the Can Pac. & this Co. which >m to come direct from A. Y. I am sorry our people have talked so much to discount the benefits from increased earnings in advance, and at the same time the transfer record showing them to be large sell ers. The situation is by no means a pleasant o encouraging one. I feel that our matters are not in the condition I wish they were & that they are more likely to get worse than better. The proposed pool of \$8,000,000 of our stock had better be postponed for the present.During the coming summer the St.P.M.& M.Ry. will be forced to compete for business with the Can Pa and this in connection with Canadian & Amer. lines which are hostile to the C.P. but are at

Already the rumor that the Grand Trunk h has bought or is about to buy the Duluth & Winnipeg makes the Chicago & orthwestern, the Mil waukee & St. Paul, the RockⁿIsland all anxious to know how they will hold their share of the traffic of the Canadian Northwest, and we canno say to them without endangering our own positio that they must keep out of the Red River Valley and at the same time, we fail to give them any chance for that business." Am going tonight to to hold annual meeting of the Manitoba Southwestern. Grading for connection with Casselton Branch admost done and `acklaying will begin

on Monday. By Dec. 1 we should have about 100 miles of Dakota Extens n. Hope to have consolidation and sale of Jasselton Branch "ready in time."
