More re Minnetonka farm job, i.e., a man under him would be supplied, along with greenhouses in time, fancy stock that Hill will want to show to his friends, "He would want to send his children out there in summer ... would probably want pet animals, garden plants and flowerbeds... He would pay \$600 per year in addition to above perquisites but wishes me to say that the salary is little object to him provided he can get the right kind of a man. He does not want anything raised for the hotel ... If you would feel I'm coming on yourself.. take a run out... Char and I would be glad to have you stop with us while in St. Paul.
