Wilson in Seattle to Hill; also June 7, 1902

Long letter re political situation in Washington; re the issue of the so-called Railroad Commission Bill, which Hill opposed as being anti-railroad. In lengthy enclosures takes up the situation by localities, as he has toured the state. "If permitted to drag along any considerable length of time I am convinced ~~AAAA~~ Attorney General and Governor with Preston as King County senatorial candidate will control the Republican state convention & lay out the campaign upon anti-railroad lines." Ankeny candidates "while favor^{able} to the railroad

interests are uniformly and actively hostile to me."
