These are large scrapbook-type, black albums, which include a series of 9 vols marked "See America First," a slogan apparently invented by Hill, consisting of mostly tinted photos (2 small vols. are sepia or black and white) of areas in the Pacific Northwest: Crater Lake (1 vol.); Mt. Baker (1 vol); Glacier National Park (3 vols.); Lake Chelan (4 vols.); and Alaska. [One volume of the Lake Chelan area is a small, unmarked one]. The Glacier Lake area vols are marked: "St. Mary Lake Area," "Lake McDonald Area," and "Swift Current Area."

Over

There is a smallish volume that shows non-tinted photos of a boat expedition of Sept. 12-Nov. 18, 1909, down the Green River in Wyoming and Utah to the Colorado and down that river to California (2 persons are mentioned in the blueprint list of pictures attached to the inside cover (rear), "Galloway," and "Deubendorff"). With these albums is one of the Picture Writing of Blackfoot Indians of Glacier Park area, mostly produced for Park hotels between 1913 and 1924, with some printed and typed lists and explanations attached. Probably belonging with these is a large canvas roll on top of oversize counter marked "Bull Robe Picture-Writing of Blackfoot Indians." There is also an album of the 1917(?) St. Paul Winter Carnival.
