

Kask, H. W. - Diaries

Diaries kept in L. W. Hill's office and on trips with him, 1922 - 1925. Formerly in Box 173 and now transferred to Box 172. Diary tells in some detail, day by day, the Hill Family's trip through Europe in 1922; from London through England, Holland, France, Switzerland, northern Italy and along the Mediterranean to Nice, then to Paris, England, and home. Diary continues with accounts of Ralph Budd's and Kask's trips and also L. W. Hill's trips to Washington, New York, West, &c.; also W. B. Dean's funeral, Dec. 7, 1922. Every day in diary is accounted for as "on office", "on line", or otherwise for Hill, since Kask went with him on most trips; als

board meetings are given and sometimes decisions at them are reported; Feb., 1923, en route to California with family, for members of Hill's family is usually accounted for in the diaries; thus, on April 24, 1923, "Hill family heirs had picture drawing in afternoon"; following days were the drawings for contents of 240 Summit, jewelry, china, silver, etc.; Dec. 14 1923, "Mrs. Slade died in N.Y." ~~Jan.~~ ^{Dec.} 14, 1923, Jerome Hill operated on at Rochester; Jan. 23, 1924, J. Henry Probst's funeral; there are only a few entries for 1924 and 1925
