This is the inmate-published newspaper at the Minnesota State Prison, Stillwater.</p> <p>Native American Religious Group, 1981-1983. 1 folder. These files cover the work of the Legal Assistance to Minnesota Prisoners (LAMP) program (provided through the University of Minnesota Law School) as legal council for OGI-CHI-DOG, Inc., the Native American culture group at the Minnesota Correctional Facility at St. Cloud.
