HISTORY OF PROJECT 2030

Project 2030 is a special project of the State of Minnesota coordinated by the Aging Initiative of the Minnesota Department of Human Services and carried out in partnership with the Minnesota Board of Aging. Its purpose is to identify the impacts of the aging of Minnesota's population and help prepare the State's response to the baby boom generation that begins turning 85 in 2030.

SCOPE AND CONTENTS OF THE PUBLICATIONS

Publications produced mainly in the initial two-year planning process (1997-1998) of Project 2030, during which staff analyzed the facts and figures associated with the state's changing demographics and presented them to over 3000 Minnesotans through a broad range of public and private groups and organizations around the state in an attempt to assess what the impact of the aging baby boomers will be on the social, health, and financial structures of the state. Included are the final report on the planning process, a briefing book, symposium and roundtable data, and research and data reports. There are also three issues papers written in 1999.

Project 2030 Data Report, Population Profiles: African American Elders, American Indian Elders, Asian American Elders, Hispanic Elders, October 1998.

The population of ethnic minority groups in Minnesota is projected into 2030 at the state and county level. Illustrative charts and maps depicting the size and geographic location of these groups are included.

Project 2030 Data Report, Population Profiles: County and Regional Data, October 1998.

The population of older Minnesotans is projected into 2025 at the state and county level. Different age segments of the older population are compared as if the number of older individuals to younger age groups. Charts and maps depicting the size and geographic location of the older population are included.

Summary of Roundtable on "Preparing Employees for 2030," November 1998.

Summarizes the discussions among 28 individuals from businesses and public employment. Issues discussed include the role of employers in helping employees plan for their retirement and the changing definition of retirement and retirement planning. The Roundtable was co-sponsored by the University of Minnesota Extension.
