# ADMINISTRATIVE HISTORY OF THE GOVERNOR'S COUNCIL ON YOUTH

The Governor's Council on Youth was created by Executive Order No. 83-35 on August 17, 1983. Its purpose was to ensure that all of Minnesota's youth be given sufficient resources and opportunities to help them become participating and productive members of society. The Council also advised the governor, monitored legislation, and served as a clearinghouse of information on youth services and programs in Minnesota.

The Council, which consisted of fifteen members, including five youths, was first located in the office of the Lieutenant Governor. In 1985 it was transferred to the Human Services Department, and in 1987 to the Education Department. It was discontinued in 1987 [Minn. Stat. 1987 c398 art10].

Kwame McDonald served as the Council's director during its entire existence.

# SCOPE AND CONTENTS OF THE RECORDS

Minutes, reports, correspondence of executive director Kwame McDonald and of the council in general, subject files on a variety of youth-related organizations and council activities, and background data on the council's formation and mission. The files document various aspects of the council's role in promoting youth programs, services, and employment opportunities.

## **RELATED MATERIALS**

The Minnesota Historical Society Museum Collections include a Council banner. The Minnesota Historical Society Library has several publications of an earlier council, the Governor's Advisory council on Children and Youth (1950s and 1960s), and the State Archives has a few files of one of its members.
