### SCOPE AND CONTENTS OF THE RECORDS

The records consist largely of incoming and outgoing correspondence concerning licenses and permits, laws and regulations, complaints, repeal of prohibition, sale of liquor on Indian reservations, and other matters related to liquor control.

There are also photographs of the commissioners, lists of licenses to sell liquor, the attorney general's opinions on liquor regulations, information on liquor labels, and some reports and publications. The Commission Administration files include reports, procedures, background information which describes the commission's duties, and financial, revenue, and taxation documents.

The records contain files on the National Conference of State Liquor Administrators, the Sister Kenny Institute, the Joint Committee of the States to Study Alcoholic Beverage Laws, and the War Savings Council of the Liquor and Wine Industries.
